Ellis Island is a federally owned island in New York Harbor that contains a museum and former immigration inspection station As the United States' busiest immigrant inspection station from 1892 to 1954, it processed approximately 12 million immigrants to the country through the Port of New York and New Jersey Today, it is part of the Statue of Liberty National Monument, accessible to the public only by ferry The north side of the island hosts the museum of immigration while the south side, including the Ellis Isl...
